This responds to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request dated and received in this Office on August 29, 2012, in which you requested various records concerning the implementation of Executive Order 13107 and complaints of alleged violations of U.S. obligations pursuant to international human rights treaties. This response is made on behalf of the Office of the Attorney General.

Please be advised that a search has been conducted of the electronic database of the Departmental Executive Secretariat, which is the official records repository for the Office of the Attorney General, and no records responsive to your request were located.

For your information, Congress excluded three discrete categories of law enforcement and national security records from the requirements of the FOIA. See 5 U.S.C. 552(c) (2006 & Supp. IV 2010). This response is limited to those records that are subject to the requirements of the FOIA. This is a standard notification that is given to all our requesters and should not be taken as an indication that excluded records do, or do not, exist.
